Scope of Study

Summary:	<p>This survey screens the adult age population of Latvia for participation in entrepreneurial activity and informal financing of businesses, as well as gathers data on different characteristics of entrepreneurs, their businesses, and non-entrepreneurs.</p> <p>This is the first dataset in Latvia that collects detailed data not only on established entrepreneurs but also on those who are in a process of starting up a new enterprise, i.e. nascent entrepreneurs.</p> <p>The survey is based on the method of the Global</p>

	<p>Entrepreneurship Monitor, the multinational research program of annual assessment of entrepreneurial activity (see http://www.gemconsortium.org for details). The standard GEM questionnaire is complemented with questions related to the background and experiences of entrepreneurs used by Djankov et al. (2005) in their study of entrepreneurship in Russia, China, Brazil, India, and Nigeria.</p> <p>The survey data cover demographic characteristics, as well as career and family background on the respondents, including information on education, skills, religious beliefs, educational attainment of parents, involvement of relatives in entrepreneurship, financial situation of the household, perceptions of corruption and entrepreneurial environment.</p> <p>The survey focuses specifically on questions related to entrepreneurs (defined as nascent and current owners-managers of enterprises). There is the data about characteristics of their businesses, entrepreneurial motivation, financing used, barriers to expansion, future expectations, experience with the court system.</p> <p>A special series of questions explores informal investors: the firms in which they invest, motivation, the amounts invested and expected in return.</p>

GEM represents a series of cross-national assessments of entrepreneurial activity, which started in 1999 with 10 participating countries, and expanded to 35 countries in 2005. Latvia participated in this project for the first time in 2005.</p>

Data Source:	20 - 65 minutes long face-to face interviews

Sampling procedure:	Two-stage stratified random sampling
Strata:	Five regions: Kurzeme, Zemgale, Latgale, Vidzeme and Riga.
Primary Sample Units:	370 sampling points
Sample:	Randomly selected adult individuals (aged 18-64 years)
Response Rate:	99%
Number of Completed Observations:	1964
Weights:	The weights are based on age, gender and geographic region.
